



LifeChurch Manchester (LCM) Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement

LifeChurch Manchester (LCM), and LifeCentre Events (LCE) annual operating incomes are below the threshold of £36m set by the Modern Slavery Act 2015. We are therefore not legally required to have a policy on modern slavery. However, we welcome the Modern Slavery Act and we support the aims of this legislation to safeguard workers from exploitation. Due to this we will ensure transparency within our organisation.

LCM and LCE have a zero-tolerance approach to modern slavery and human trafficking, therefore we will not support or deal with any business knowingly involved in slavery or human trafficking. We are committed to continually improving our practices to help identify and combat modern slavery and human trafficking.

LCM Trustees and LCE Directors, along with senior management, shall take responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives. They shall provide adequate resources and investment to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place within the organisation.

Disciplinary action will be taken against any employee who breaches this policy.
